What a hot day it was! Thank you to the many people who braved the heat and came along to enjoy the event. It was great to see Teddies flying up and down on the zip wire from the church tower, circus tricks being performed, Candy Floss and Toffee Apples being consumed as well as ale, tea and cake, the music from Annie, Martin and Jude, accompanied by their amazing puppets completing the great atmosphere. We were also pleased to have so many people coming into the church to find out about the repairs needed to the church roof and to see how we were progressing through the development phase of our National Lottery Heritage Fund grant. We are grateful to the NHLF and their players for this support.

A huge thankyou to everyone who helped to prepare, who helped through the afternoon and who provided cakes and who helped to clear away afterwards, on such a hot day it was an amazing effort from you all and very much appreciated.

The donations on at the event for the repair of our church roof amounted to £391.48. Thank you to everyone who contributed.

Badingham Church Bells

It is always lovely to hear the bells rung and to have them welcome us to services. That doesn't just happen of course, the ringers practice and the bells must be serviced and maintained. Thank you, Jason, for looking after Badingham's bells and for getting the repairs that were needed done to the ropes.

Church Roof

We are continuing to work through the Development Phase of our National Heritage Lottery Fund grant.

The open afternoon held in the village hall in conjunction with our Activity Consultant and Evaluation Consultant was very well supported and very valuable to help inform our consultants about Badingham and people's views on what they would like to see happening in the village and church. The Activity Consultant has since interviewed people in Halesworth, Southwold and Framlingham seeking their views on Badingham.

Alan has submitted the quarterly report to the NHLF ready for our meeting with our lottery advisors next week.

David Carrington from Skillingtons has begun his survey of the Cotton tomb in the church chancel and will be back again on July 22nd to complete his survey.

We have an important meeting with the Lottery Fund in October when they look at all our draft repair specifications, our permissions from the Diocese for the repair, our activity plans for the future and our readiness to submit an application for a grant. We are hoping to submit our application for the grant for the repairs in February.

All residents of Dennington and Badingham parishes are invited to an **Open Evening and BBQ at Dennington Hall Farm on September 12th** at 4.30. This is our opportunity to show some of what we do and hear your thoughts about the land we farm. To help with numbers, please email info@denningtonhall.com if you know that you would like to come.

This year, instead of having an Open Farm Sunday we took a stand at the Suffolk Show . With the stand beside the Foxhall entrance many thousands of people came past giving us an opportunity to explain what we are doing on the farm. Laura, Ryan, Ed, Tim and Kate had an extremely busy two days talking to people. We shared the stand with Restore Ecology, who are helping with our Turtle Dove Restoration project, No Fence livestock collars, whose collars we use to allow the cattle and goats to graze unfenced areas, Wild Farmed, for whom we are growing wheat and barley, and we had a drone on the stand to show how new technology is helping farm in different ways. Bruisyard Country Estate provided canapes and showed how the different aspects of farming and hospitality are connected. I was very proud of the way the team presented what we are doing here. The Suffolk Show is a celebration of much that is special about Suffolk; we all enjoyed being a part of it.

The farm has also become a demonstration farm for the Agriculture and Horticulture Development Board (AHDB). 60 people from farms and connected rural businesses came round the farm recently on our launch event. This is a three year commitment and our target areas for discussion include succession and sustainability. We have also hosted evening walks for the Country Land and Business Association, Framlingham Farmers staff and Harleston Young Farmers.

Teresa, Ryan and Sally have acted as Stewards at the Suffolk Agricultural Association's School Farm and Country Fair and the Farm Student Day.

The meat boxes from our small herd of Red Polls have been selling well. Many thanks to those who have tried them and for their appreciative comments. The link for ordering is https://www.denningtonhallfarms.co.uk/farm-produce

We have been joined in our team here on the farm by Ed Blake as assistant farm manager who has moved down from Norfolk and another Matt as sprayer driver – Matt Wilson. Bradley Leist continues in his key role while Lucas Foster, Connor Iveson and Jasper Maberly will be joining us for harvest. Sean Howlett continues to look after the hedges. We look forward to seeing many of you here in September after harvest.





Ticketmaster

Once again, I advise caution when using Ticketmaster to buy your tickets for various events. They were hacked in 2024 and a significant amount of customer data (names, addresses etc) was stolen. Customers whose data was stolen are more at risk of fraud, identity theft and scams. It's sensible for us all to monitor our bank accounts for fraud and be cautious of unsolicited emails, especially those with links, attachments or requests for personal information.

Drug Driving

Shockingly, thousands of motorists have been caught drug-driving multiple times, sparking calls for the introduction of rehabilitation courses for offenders. In data for the 11 years to July 2024, 33,020 British drivers had been convicted of this offence multiple times. Of these, 3431 motorists had been caught on four or more occasions and 54 had been prosecuted 10 times. Do be careful on the road.

Card Fraud

Contactless payment is increasingly popular, with at least 1 in 3 card payments using this technology. If a card is lost or stolen, unauthorised payments, up to £100 each time, can be made without a PIN code. There are many myths relating to the security of this payment system. I will explain more about the process in the next Echo.

As a warning, I had someone attempt to access my account while on holiday in May. I shall not be using contactless payment any more.
